

- An all-terrain vehicle travels on four or more low pressure tires and has a seat or saddle designed to be straddled by the operator.

- An all-terrain vehicle may be operated only between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

- A three wheeled all-terrain vehicle shall not be operated in the City of Alliance.

- An all-terrain vehicle shall not be operated at a speed in excess of thirty miles per hour and shall observe posted speed limits if lower than thirty miles per hour.

- When operating an all-terrain vehicle the headlight and taillight of the vehicle shall be on.

- Whenever an all-terrain vehicle is moving, all cargo must be securely attached to the vehicle in such a manner that the cargo will remain secured without any assistance of the operator.

- Every all-terrain vehicle shall be equipped with a bicycle safety flag which extends no less than six feet above the ground attached to the rear of the vehicle.

- All all-terrain vehicles must have a brake system maintained in good operating condition.

- All all-terrain vehicles must have an adequate muffler system in good working condition and a United States Forest Service qualified spark arrester.

- Any person operating an all-terrain vehicle shall be 19 years of age and have a valid Class O operator's license.

- It shall be unlawful to operate an all-terrain vehicle in the City of Alliance without first obtaining a registration sticker for the current year from the Alliance Police Department.

- The Alliance Police Department will issue the all-terrain vehicle registration at a charge of \$ 25.00, and the owner must provide proof of insurance to obtain registration.

- Any person operating an all-terrain vehicle shall have liability insurance coverage for the all-terrain vehicle while operating it on the street or roadway.

- An all-terrain vehicle shall not be operated on Third Street or Box Butte Avenue between 1st and 16th Streets.

- After yielding the right-of-way to other traffic, safely crossing of these streets must be done at a 90 degree angle.

WARNING

All-terrain vehicles must not be operated on City streets and alleys for pleasure.

Violators of the ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

IMPORTANT SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS

- Although not required by ordinance, a DOT rated helmet is a good idea.

- Never leave your all-terrain vehicle unattended while running.

- Secure your all-terrain vehicle to the best of your ability when unattended. Remove keys and lock any compartments which contain valuable items.

- Mirrors are a good idea, be constantly watching traffic around you and behind you. You have no protection around you.
