**C. Ordinance No. 2854 – Third Reading
Classification Plan Amendments**

This ordinance has been prepared for Council's consideration to amend our current Classification Plan. Staff is requesting several modifications to match the organizational changes being recommended by the City Manager.

D. Resolution No. 18-32 – Aerial Sprayer Lease with Tony Peterson

Resolution No. 18-32 will authorize entering into a Lease Agreement with Tony Peterson, doing business as Last Pass Aviation for aerial spraying operations at the Alliance Municipal Airport.

E. Resolution No. 18-33 – Amendment to Scott Aviation Lease

This resolution will approve an amendment to the current Lease Agreement with Scott Aviation, Inc. for their aerial spraying operations. The amendment provides for an additional area east of the Airport Maintenance Shop.

F. Resolution No. 18-34 – Police Department Translator Policy

Resolution No. 18-34 will approve a new policy for the Alliance Police Department. The new policy provides for the use of a translator service for the deaf and hard of hearing persons when calling our police dispatch operations. This service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

G. Resolution No. 18-35 – Amendment to the FOP Contract

An amendment to the current FOP Contract is being proposed to provide for an On-Call Status for our police officers at the discretion of the Police Chief or his designee. This is being proposed for implementation due to our current police officer shortage and will only be used when scheduling deems it necessary. Resolution No. 18-35 will approve the amendment.

H. Resolution No. 18-36 – Museum Partners Donation

Resolution No. 18-36 will accept the gracious donation of the Museum Partners for the purchase and installation of a commercial display screen for use in the Knight Museum and Sandhills Center Theater. This will replace the projector system we were using, which has failed. The donation is valued at approximately \$4,600.

I. Resolution No. 18-37 – Swimming Pool Rates

This resolution will update our swimming pool rates which have been in place since 2006.

J. Resolution No. 18-38 – Women’s Locker Fee at the Golf Course

At our last meeting, the Council approved increasing the women’s locker rent to \$35.00 per year. This was recommended as new larger lockers were recently installed. This is the only adjustment being proposed in golf fees for the 2018 season. Resolution No. 18-38 will approve the proposed increase.

K. Resolution No. 18-39 – City Council Contingency Account Authority

Resolution No. 18-39 will authorized the transfer of \$84,000 from the City Council Contingency Account to the Police Pension Account. This will take care of the defined benefit plan which was required for police officers hired before 1984, as our last officer in this category retired in December 2017.

L. Board Appointments and Resignations


The City has received the resignation of Connie Laing from the Alliance Park and Tree Board. Her vacated term has an expiration date of February 28, 2020.
