The Alliance City Council met in a Regular Meeting, May 4, 2021, at 7:00 p.m. in the Alliance Learning Center Community Meeting Room, 1750 Sweetwater Avenue, Alliance, Nebraska. A notice of meeting was published in the Alliance Times Herald on April 28, 2021. The notice stated the date, hour and place of the meeting, that the meeting was open to the public, and that an agenda of the meeting, kept continuously current, was available for public inspection at the office of the City Clerk in City Hall; provided the Council could modify the agenda at the meeting if it determined an emergency so required. A similar notice, together with a copy of the agenda, also had been delivered to each of the City Council Members. An agenda, kept continuously current, was available for public inspection at the office of the City Clerk during regular business hours from the publication of the notice to the time of the meeting.

Mayor Dafney opened the May 4, 2021 regular meeting of the Alliance, Nebraska City Council at 7:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Dafney, Council Members Mischnick, Jones, Bentley and McGhehey. Also present were Finance Director Waggener, City Attorney Hoelsing and City Clerk Johnson.

- Mayor Dafney read the Open Meetings Act Announcement.
- Council was first introduced to new City of Alliance employees, Kelly McCauley, Refuse Collection Driver and Nalani Stewart, Part-time Library Clerk.
- Council next proclaimed the week of May 2-8 as Public Service Week. Councilman Mischnick presented the following proclamation:

### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS; Americans are served every single day by public servants at the federal, state, county and local levels. These unsung heroes do the work that keeps our nation and community functioning. At all levels of government, our public servants put our country and our people first; and

WHEREAS; The women and men who work for our government tackle some of the most important challenges and opportunities facing our community, country and the global community; and

WHEREAS; Public employees are hired to not only fill a job, but take oaths that they will do it the best they are able; and

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WHEREAS; Many public servants, including police officers, firefighters and military personnel, risk their lives each day in service to the public and others commit countless hours to provide basic and leisure services to citizens improving their quality of life and the community; and

WHEREAS; Public servants include accountants and street workers... landfill operators and elected officials . . . librarians and safety inspectors . . . utility and parks workers and countless other occupations. Day in and day out they provide the diverse services needed by the neighbors of Alliance with efficiency and integrity; and

WHEREAS; These public servants, at every level, provide continuity that would be impossible without them in a democracy and ensures that the quality of life in America, and the City of Alliance, is the best it can be. These public employees are the ones who, with the help and support of every neighbor, work every day to promote our community vision; "Building the Best Hometown in America."

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of Alliance, Nebraska, does announce and proclaim to all citizens the week of May 2 – 8, 2021, as

● The Consent Calendar was the next matter before Council. A motion was made by Councilman Bentley and seconded by Councilman Jones to approve the Consent Calendar as follows:

### **CONSENT CALENDAR – May 4, 2021**

1. **Approval:** Minutes of the Regular Meeting, April 20, 2021; Minutes of the Special Meeting, April 28, 2021.
2. **Approval:** Payroll Costs for the period April 3, 2021 through April 16, 2021: \$228,611.26.
3. **Approval:** Claims against the following funds for the period of April 20, 2021 through April 28, 2021: General, General Debt Service, Trust and Agency, Street, Electric, Refuse Collection and Disposal, Sanitary Sewer, Water, Golf Course, Downtown Improvement Districts, R.S.V.P., Keno, and Capital Improvement; \$181,209.55.
4. **Approval:** Resolution No. 21-41 will approve the amendment to the Personnel Policy in regards to residency.

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5. Approval: The Chamber of Commerce is requesting permission to conduct the Annual Heritage Days Parade on July 17, 2021. Resolution No. 21-42 will formally acknowledge that the City of Alliance will accept the duties required by the State of Nebraska to conduct the Heritage Days Parade on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street which is a designated State Highway. The event will take place on July 17, 2021 beginning at 9:45 a.m. to the conclusion of the parade that will be no later than 12:00 noon. This resolution meets the requirements of the Nebraska Legislature.
6. Approval: The Special Events Request/Use of Public Facilities Parks, Streets of the Alliance Chamber of Commerce for Heritage Days 2021 scheduled for July 13<sup>th</sup> through the 18<sup>th</sup>. This year's requests are similar to last year. Proof of liability insurance is required as part of the authorization.
7. Approval: The capital budget transfer for the Alliance Learning Center to repair the current surveillance system. \$6,000 will be transferred from Capital Outlay – Vehicles 01-71-71-59-960 to Capital Outlay – Machine, Equipment 01-71-77-59-940.
8. Approval: The capital budget transfer for the Alliance Landfill for scale repairs. \$27,000 will be transferred from Capital Outlay – Machine, Equipment 06-51-55-59-950 to NRCNTSVC – Other Machine, Equipment 06-51-55-44-489.
9. Approval: The capital budget transfer for the Alliance Municipal Airport to replace the fixed base operator automated gate. \$13,000 will be transferred from Capital Outlay – Buildings 22-41-43-59-915 to Capital Outlay – Wildlife Fence 22-41-43-59-971.

NOTE: Interim Managers Johnson and Waggener have reviewed these expenditures and to the best of their knowledge confirms that they are within budgeted appropriations to this point in the fiscal year.

Any item listed on the Consent Calendar may, by the request of any single Council Member, be considered as a separate item in the Regular Agenda.

- The first item on the agenda for Council was Resolution No. 21-43 which will approve the Preliminary Plat application of Dan Dickinson for Lots 1 and 2, Block 1, Syndicate Addition to the City of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska. The following information was provided:

[The City of Alliance is in receipt of an application for a Preliminary Plat from Dan Dickinson on behalf of Syndicate Block Company LLC. The Preliminary Plat shows the splitting of Block 1, Syndicate Addition to the City of Alliance, into two

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lots and the dedication of an access easement for public access through the parking lot to both proposed lots.

The subject property is located at the southwest corner of West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Cody Avenue. The land is currently zoned C-3, Heavy Commercial. It is surrounded by C-3, Heavy Commercial. A rezone is not necessary or proposed with the replat. There are not any minimum lot sizes or dimensions required by the C-3 zoning district. The plat will not create any new nonconforming yards or structures. The portion proposed to be split off is currently used for equipment sales and rental and is located at the northeast corner of Block 1. The rest of the lot is used for a shopping center and its parking lot.

The City of Alliance Planning Commission met at its regular meeting April 13, 2021 and found that the preliminary plat meets the requirements of the Alliance Municipal Code and Comprehensive Plan. They voted yes on a recommendation to the Alliance City Council for the approval of the Preliminary Plat of Lots 1 and 2, Block 1, Syndicate Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

The Planning Commission made the following findings of fact in their motion:

- The land use and zoning are consistent with the characteristics of the West Gateway Neighborhood as identified by the Comprehensive Plan as they are adjacent to an arterial and commercial in nature.
- The easement will allow the proposed two lots to share access to the driveways.
- The plat will not create any nonconforming yards or structures.
- The plat meets the minimum requirements of Code.]

A motion was made by Councilman Bentley, seconded by McGhehey to approve Resolution No. 21-43 which follows in its entirety:

#### RESOLUTION NO. 21-43

*WHEREAS*, An application for a Preliminary Plat for Lots 1 and 2, Block 1, Syndicate Addition, to the City of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska has been received; and

*WHEREAS*, The Planning Commission held a public hearing on April 13, 2021, and has recommended the approval of the Preliminary Plat; and

*WHEREAS*, The Preliminary Plat shows the splitting of Block 1, Syndicate Addition to the City of Alliance, into two lots and the dedication of an access easement for public access through the parking lot.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED* by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, that the Preliminary Plat for Lots 1 and 2, Block 1, Syndicate Addition to the City of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska. is hereby approved.

- Resolution No. 21-44 which will authorize the use of \$22,800 from Water Contingency Funds for the inspection and repairs to the City's Arsenic Treatment plants was next on the agenda. The following information was provided:

[Three arsenic removal plants were constructed for the City of Alliance in 2010. These three plants have been in daily operation for the last eleven years. Over the past several months, there has been a change in the level of effectiveness of these plants and the number of hours they can run without maintenance has decreased consistently. There have also been several electronic actuator valves malfunctioning.

Layne Christensen Company has provided a quote of \$22,752 to inspect the filter media levels of these plants and replace six of the malfunctioning valves. Layne Christensen is the original manufacturer of the treatment facilities and the only known source for filter media inspection. These treatment plants will run 24 hours per day in summer months and are critical for the production of safe drinking water. Staff recommends use of water system contingency funds of \$22,800 to complete this work with payment from NRCNTSVC – Other Machine, Equipment (GL #08-52-51-44-489).]

A motion was made by Councilman McGhehey, seconded by Councilman Mischnick to approve Resolution No. 21-44 which follows in its entirety:

RESOLUTION NO. 21-44

*WHEREAS*, The City of Alliance operates the Alliance Municipal Water System; and

*WHEREAS*, Layne Christensen Company of Valley, Nebraska constructed the arsenic plants in 2010, and

*WHEREAS*, Layne Christensen Company provided a quote in the amount of \$22,752 to inspect the filter medial levels of the plants and to replace six malfunctioning valves; and

*WHEREAS*, A transfer in the amount of \$22,800 from Water System Contingency to NRCNTSVC – Other Machine, Equipment (GL# 08-52-51-44-489) is required to complete the repairs and maintenance.

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*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, by the Mayor and City Council of Alliance, Nebraska, approves the quote of Layne Christensen Company of Valley, NE in the amount of \$22,752 to repair the three arsenic treatment plants for the municipal water system of the City of Alliance

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*, A budget transfer in the amount of \$22,800 from Water System Contingency to NRCNTSVC – Other Machine, Equipment (GL# 08-52-51-44-489) is hereby authorized.

- Council next considered Resolution No. 21-45 which will authorize the amendment to the Authorized Strength document within the Alliance Police Department. The following information was provided:

[The Police Department has a unique circumstance occurring which justify additional authorized strength prior to adoption of the new budget. Following are the details relating to the request:

Currently two of our police officers are active in the military reserve program and both are assigned to the same military company. Although they have not been provided exact orders, they have been given notice that they will have a long-term deployment for approximately nine months. Given the complexity of hiring police officers and the requirement for certification if the department were to advertise once the officers are deployed, there would be no coverage in time to fill their vacancy, leaving the force short and the community disadvantaged. Based upon the Police Department's Strategic Plan, the department has need to add up to five additional police officer positions in order to adequately staff the street with full-time equivalents. There will be salary savings initially until the officers are back from deployment. There will be an ongoing impact to the annual budget once the officers return; however, staff will be seeking grants to assist with the extra positions.]

A motion was made by Councilman McGhehey, seconded by Jones to approve Resolution No. 21-45 which follows in its entirety:

#### RESOLUTION NO. 21-45

*WHEREAS*, The City of Alliance utilizes the Council-Manager form of government, in which the City Manager acts as the Chief Executive Officer for the City; and

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*WHEREAS*, The City Manager, appointed by the City Council and serving at their pleasure, is responsible for planning, organizing, staffing, directing, coordinating, researching, and budgeting the operations of the City in order to implement Council policies in an efficient and effective manner; and

*WHEREAS*, To implement the policies of the City Council the City Manager has to be able to hire the necessary employees to fulfill the obligations of the City of Alliance to the citizens of Alliance; and

*WHEREAS*, The City of Alliance needs to account for, track and budget the expenditures for employees; and

*WHEREAS*, The budget is directly related to the number of employees that are authorized to be hired by the City of Alliance.

*WHEREAS*, Due to additional need at the Police Department, modifications are needed to be made within the Alliance Police Department for Fiscal Year 2020-2021.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED* by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, that the City approve and adopt the “Total Authorized Strength” as follows:

- The next item on the agenda was Resolution No. 21-46 which authorizes the City to enter into a new Lease Agreement with Denver Air Connection for a term of June 1, 2021 to May 31, 2023. The following information was provided:

[The Department of Transportation selected Denver Air Connection to provide Essential Air Service to Alliance for a two-year period. This resolution will approve a lease agreement between the City of Alliance and Denver Air Connection. The lease states that Denver Air Connection will pay the City the amount of \$775 per month and in return the

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City agrees to provide 752 square feet of terminal space to Denver Air Connection to conduct scheduled transportation to and from Alliance.]

A motion was made by Councilman McGhehey, seconded by Bentley to approve Resolution No. 21-46 which follows in its entirety:

RESOLUTION NO. 21-46

*WHEREAS*, The City of Alliance owns and operates a municipal airport; and

*WHEREAS*, Denver Air Connection is a common carrier providing essential air service to Alliance, Nebraska; and

*WHEREAS*, The lease for terminal space is required to facilitate operations of the commercial air service; and

*WHEREAS*, Staff has prepared an Airport Use Agreement which has been approved by the Airline.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, by the Mayor and City Council of Alliance, Nebraska, that the lease with Denver Air Connection for space in the Alliance Municipal Airport terminal, is hereby approved for the term June 1, 2021 to May 31, 2023 and the Mayor is authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the City.

- Resolution No. 21-47 was next on the agenda for Council and will authorize the Utility and Access Easement Agreement between the City of Alliance and Mobius Communications Company. The following information was provided:

[This resolution will approve a utility and access easement agreement between the City of Alliance and Mobius Communications Company. Mobius Communications Company received a grant to extend a fiber optic line from Highway 2 south to the airport property.]

The road to the Airport is not a dedicated “public right of way” and therefore a private-party easement is necessary for the fiber optic line to be located and installed. Airport tenants and staff are very excited and appreciative to have fiber on the property.]

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A motion was made by Councilman Jones, seconded by Mischnick to approve Resolution No. 21-47 which follows in its entirety:

RESOLUTION NO. 21-47

*WHEREAS*, Mobius Communications Company has the desire to install fiber optic line within the Alliance Municipal Airport property; and

*WHEREAS*, The location of the fiber optic line will not be within a City or State right of way, and a private party easement is necessary to locate, install, and maintain the fiber optic line; and

*WHEREAS*, The City desires to enter in to an Utility and Access Easement Agreement with Mobius Communications Company for the installation of an underground fiber optic line from Highway 2 to the Alliance Municipal Airport; and

*WHEREAS*, City Council believes it is in the best interest of the City of Alliance to enter an Utility and Access Easement Agreement with Mobius Communications Company.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED* by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, that the Utility and Access Easement Agreement with Mobius Communications Company is approved; and

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Utility and Access Easement Agreement on behalf of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

- The Council next reviewed Resolution No. 21-48 which recommends approval to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission on behalf of Angela Coffey as the liquor license manager for GNS Corporation dba Git N Split. The following information was provided:

[The City of Alliance is in receipt of a Manager Application from Angela Coffey for the liquor license of GNS Corporation dba Git N Split, 611 West Third Street, Alliance, Nebraska. Ms. Coffey has completed the Responsible Beverage Service Training in Nebraska. Police Chief Lukens has completed a background check and has found no reason to deny the application.]

A motion was made by Councilman Jones, seconded by Mischnick to approve Resolution No. 21-48 which follows in its entirety:

RESOLUTION NO. 21-48

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*WHEREAS*, The City of Alliance has received a notice and copy of a Manager Application for GNS Corporation dba Git N Split, 611 West Third Street, Alliance, Nebraska submitted by Angela Coffey; and

*WHEREAS*, City staff has reviewed the application and finds no reason why the proposed manager, Angela Coffey, would be disqualified from serving as manager.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, that the Manager's Application of Angela Coffey for GNS Corporation dba Git N Split, 611 West Third Street, Alliance, Nebraska is hereby recommended for approval to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*, that the City Clerk shall notify the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission of this Council decision.

- Resolution No. 21-49 which will award the SkyView Golf Course Cart Storage addition and storm repairs bid to K.L. Wood and Company, LLC of Alliance, NE was next on the agenda. The following information was provided for Council:

[Last year, City staff obtained projections to expand the cart storage barn. What originally was hoped to be a \$20,000 to \$30,000 project saw initial projections of \$54,500 to \$55,900. Staff bundled the cart barn expansion project with the golf course storm repair project anticipating lower costs with the larger bid package. The bid packet was prepared and distributed by Jack Baker & Associates with bid openings on April 29. Two bids were received with K.L. Wood & Co. LLC of Alliance being the lowest overall bid at \$157,688.20. (Bids are guaranteed through May 5 only, because of fluctuating steel prices.)

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Based on present golf cart storage rates and an estimated sixteen stalls, the cart barn expansion would have approximately a ten-year recovery period. There are currently ten golfers on a waiting list for storage space. There was also some discussion of pre-renting the spaces to accumulate upfront funds. The project was included in the 2020-21 budget at \$30,000.

Staff is providing justification to Travelers Insurance to justify a 36% increase in the replacement cost value, primarily due to increased building supply costs. Since the storm damage estimates from the July 9, 2020 were unknown at the time the budget was adopted, a transfer of budget authority will be necessary. A transfer from Airport Capital Outlay-Runways account (GL #22-41-43-59-915) into the Golf Capital Outlay-Buildings (GL #21-71-75-59-915) in the amount of \$135,000.

If Council chooses not to move forward with the cart barn expansion, the project will need to be rebid for the storm damage repairs only.]

A motion was made by Councilman McGhehey, seconded by Bentley to approve Resolution No. 21-49 which follows in its entirety:

RESOLUTION NO. 21-49

*WHEREAS*, The City of Alliance owns and operates the SkyView Golf Course; and

*WHEREAS*, The City working with our engineers prepared a Request for Qualification and Bid Invitation which included the plans and specifications for the Cart Storage and Storm Repairs; and

*WHEREAS*, The City received two bids for the project; and

*WHEREAS*, The lowest, responsive and responsible bidder was K.L. Wood and Co. LLC of Alliance, NE in the amount of One Hundred Fifty-seven Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars and 20/100ths (\$157,688.20); and

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, by the Mayor and City Council of Alliance, Nebraska, the Mayor is authorized to enter into and execute a contract with K.L. Wood and Co. LLC of Alliance, NE for the SkyView Golf Course Cart Storage and Storm Repair project subject to terms and conditions of the bid.

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*, that the Cultural and Leisure Services Director is authorized to make field change orders not to exceed five percent (5%) of the total contract amount without further Council approval.

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*, A budget transfer in the amount of \$135,000 from the Airport Capital Outlay-Runways GL#22-41-43-59-915 to Golf Capital Outlay-Buildings GL#21-71-75-59-915 is hereby approved.

- The presentation and acceptance of the Second Quarter Financial Statement was next before Council.

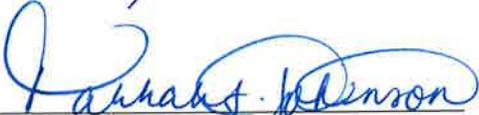
