B. ACE Proclamation

The City of Alliance will accept a Membership Distribution Check from ACE (Public Alliance for Community Energy) in the amount of \$12,260. To date, \$250,455 has been returned to the City from ACE. ACE funds are utilized towards a project or program for the betterment of our community. The Alliance City Council encourages the citizens of Alliance to select ACE as their natural gas supplier during the Choice Gas selection period, April 1 through April 21, 2022.

C. Resolution No. 22-20 – Intent to Dissolve Downtown Improvement District Boards

The Downtown Improvement Districts Boards (BID) met on January 25th to discuss the future of the BID. Due to lack of interest, it is being recommended the A-1 and A-1 Downtown Improvement Districts be dissolved. Resolution No. 22-20 is before Council for their review.

D. Resolution No. 22-21 – Refuse Truck Financing Approval

Nebraska Revised State Statute 18-201 authorizes cities of the First Class to borrow money from insured banks up to 10% of their annual budget when borrowing through traditional bonds is not practical or cost-effective. Resolution No. 22-21 authorizes the City to apply for financing with Platte Valley Bank in order to finance the new Freightliner Refuse Truck.

E. Resolution No. 22-22 – Animal Control Officer Vehicle Purchase Approval

Resolution No. 22-22 authorizes the purchase of a 2017 Ford Explorer from Transwest Auto of Torrington, Wyoming in the amount of \$26,495 to replace the animal control vehicle that was totaled in an accident last fall.

F. Resolution No. 22-23 – Library Bookmobile Vehicle Purchase and Foundation Donation Acceptance

Library staff is requesting the purchase of a 2018 Jeep Renegade Latitude from Fremont Motors of Scottsbluff, NE in the amount of \$17,349 to be utilized for delivery services at the Library. The City received \$5,975 in ARPA Funds to go towards this purchase and the Alliance Library Foundation has generously donated the remaining balance of \$11,374. Resolution No. 22-23 will authorize the purchase of the vehicle and accept the donation of the Alliance Library Foundation.


